

Raingear

- waterproof jacket with hood (we do have some extras to lend out)
- rainpants (we don't recommend the cheap vinyl ones from Canadian Tire, they always rip)
- waterproof hat or toque, or a ball cap to help keep rain off your face

High rubber boots

-these are important for beach trips (we have some extras to lend out)

Warm clothes

-wool sweaters, fleece, long johns, wool socks etc., items that allow you to layer-up. There is a coin laundry available on site, so don't bring too much!

Gloves

-wool or fleece preferably

optional: a pair of dishwashing gloves to keep your hands dry when sorting through the material from the dredges etc.

Flashlight / Headlamp - with new batteries, you will be using this a lot!

Sleeping Bag

- pillow & pillow case already provided, but avoid the \$15 extra charge for bedding by bringing your own.

Personal items - towel, toothbrush, shampoo, etc.

Daypack - as waterproof as possible.

Pencils/pens, notebook - for a biological log of all species seen while in Bamfield.

Binoculars - nice to have, but not essential. Waterproof ones are best

Camera

- with charger / spare batteries, extra memory card. If not a waterproof model, bring a Ziploc bag for storage

Money

- you may need to buy meals en-route, also t-shirts and souvenir items are available at the Marine Sciences Centre (we do have a debit machine also)

Plastic bag(s)

- Ziplocs for waterproof storage of camera, phones, binoculars, etc.

- Garbage bag to keep clothes dry inside day pack (also becomes a fashionable rain poncho in a pinch)
